James H. Hayter was a native of
Virginia who emigrated to Missouri
about 1816, settling in the village of
New Franklin, then a small hamlet in
the very outskirts of civilization. Here
he established a sawmill and a flouring
mill and also engaged in other
manufacturing and agricultural
pursuits, becoming one of the leading
business men of his community.

He married Sarah Fulkerson, a native of Lee County, Virginia, and a descendent of one of the old families of the south. They continued to reside in New Franklin until 1856, when they became victims of the cholera epidemic which swept over Missouri and the states along the Mississippi.
